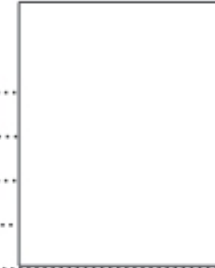

SCHOOL RULES



For Students

1. All pupils should be present in school on the opening day of each term.
2. Irregular attendance, unjustified absence or objectionable moral behaviour justifies dismissal.
3. Late comers will not be allowed to enter the school premises.
4. No books other than required text books or periodicals approved by the Principal will be brought to school premises. Anything other than indispensable articles will be confiscated and disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulter students.
5. Students should not carry items such as combs, Mobile phones, toys or any type of collectable cards, I pods, perfume sprays, pen drives, CD etc., to school. If found with the student, such items will be confiscated and disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulter students.
6. No child should leave the premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal/Vice Principal/Head Mistress.
7. For any damage to the school property made by a student, he/she will have to pay the fine or replace the article. The decision of the Principal regarding this will be final.
8. **All students must be habitually clean and always be neatly dressed. Each student should come to school in proper School uniform (as mentioned in the diary).**
9. Male students should have army cut hair style. Female students should have properly dressed hair with two plaits/braids tied with red ribbon.
10. Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises. No such act will go unnoticed or may lead to immediate dismissal of student from the school. Decision of the Principal regarding this will be final.
Bullying includes physical intimidation/attack, verbal abuse, unwanted attention and advances, damaging property or spreading malicious rumors for the victim.
Any such incidence causing severe distress and detrimental effort or the person who is involved should be immediately brought into the notice of School Administration.
11. Students coming on cycles are required to lock it. If not locked, the school will not be responsible for any loss. Fine will be charged if the cycle is found unlocked during the school hours.
12. All pupils when admitted and while studying in the school must make themselves acquainted with the rules notified for their conduct.
13. Ignorance of the rules will not be excused.
14. **The diary should be brought to the school daily.**

RULES CONCERNING ABSENCE

1. Those who are absent for one/two days should get it entered in get it sanctioned by the Class Teacher.
2. Those who are absent for more than two days should get the leave sanctioned by the Principal.
3. Medical certificate should be produced in case of long leave because of any sickness.
4. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than six days renders the students liable to have his/her name struck off the school.
5. 75% attendance is mandatory to appear in the final examination.

ASSEMBLY RULES

1. All the students are required to be present for the daily School Assembly.
2. Permission of getting excused from the assembly on medical ground should be taken from the Vice Principal/Head Mistress/Discipline and class teacher.
3. Disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters.
4. Students are required to maintain proper discipline and decorum during the School Assembly.
5. Remember that the school assembly not only provides information regarding the school events and the world events but is also a platform for all the students to express their thoughts and talents.

LIBRARY RULES

1. All the students, teachers and other employees of the school are the members of the library.
2. Members should not spoil, damage or mark the page of any library book.
3. Members are responsible for any damage caused by them to the library book and shall be required to pay penalty imposed.
4. Any damage detected in a book must be reported to the librarian before issuing the same, failing which they shall be held responsible for the same.
5. The issued book should not be passed to the other student in any regard.
6. In case a student fails to replace a lost or damaged book within 15 days from the date of its return, full cost of the book will be charged as penalty. /
7. A fine of 1.00 per day will be collected for an issued book kept beyond the date of return.
8. Silence should be observed in the library.
9. The library will remain open on all working days from 8.00 am to 4.00 pm.



SCIENCE LABORATORY RULES

1. Students must wear lab coat in the laboratory.
2. Students must maintain perfect silence in the laboratory.
3. Reagents and apparatus should be kept in their proper place before leaving the lab.
4. Used filter paper and other waste items should be thrown in dust bin and not in sink.
5. Chemicals should be used with extra care.
6. For any damage to the school apparatus/equipment fine will be charged.



SPORTS RULES

1. Students are expected to maintain discipline in the play ground.
2. Students must wear proper sports uniform and shoes while playing the game.
3. Students must follow the rules of the games and show sports man spirit while playing any game.
4. For any voluntary damage to sports equipment fine will be charged.
5. Students should not be seen loitering around in the School Ground without any official reason. Disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulter.



EXAMINATION RULES

1. All the students are expected to be present for all the examinations conducted during the session.
2. In case of medical emergencies school has to be intimated and Medical Certificate needs to be produced for the retest.
3. In case the students are not able to take the test for some other reason permission should be taken from Principal/Vice Principal/ Head Mistress. ;
4. Absolute silence has to be maintained in the Examination Hall by all the students.
5. In case a child is caught using unfair means in any of the examination/class test, disciplinary action will be taken against him/her.



OUR EXPECTATIONS FROM PARENTS

1. Check regularly the child's school diary and home work note books and ensure that all take-home assignments are completed in time.
2. Discuss with the child, problems faced by him / her in coping with the scholastic and non-scholastic activities.
3. Encourage children to read books/reviews/dailies suitable to their age so that they learn to seek knowledge on their own, make learning a leasurable experience for them.
4. Late comers will not be allowed to enter the school premises. They will be sent back home. After closure of the school gate the student should return home under their own arrangements. School will not be responsible for any mishap that happens on route. Parents should guide students accordingly.
5. The names of such students will be struck off from the school record, if he/she is absent for six consecutive days, without prior permission.
6. Parents must not send their children to school when he or she is suffering from any disease. In case of sickness, inform the school immediately and later send a medical as well as fitness certificate. Any child who is undergoing prolonged treatment should be brought to the notice of the class teacher/subject teachers in writing by the parents.
7. If a child has an appointment with a doctor, the child should not be sent to School.
8. Producing a false medical certificate for absence from school will be penalised by rustication from school without any further warning.

9. Parents are requested not to withdraw their wards during school hours except in unavoidable circumstances.
10. Parents are welcome to meet the subject teachers/class teacher of their wards on Parent teacher meeting. Their positive suggestions for overall development of student's personality is solicited.
11. Parents must attend the parent-teacher meetings. In case they are likely to be out of station, prior information in writing should be sent to the Principal who will on their return arrange their interview with the respective teachers of their ward.
12. Parents will not, for any reason, go to the classroom during school hours. They will contact the school authorities in case of any emergency. Point regarding any lapse on part of the teacher should be communicated to the Principal vice Principal/Head Mistress verbally or in writing. Under no circumstances Parents should behave rudely and insultingly with the teachers.
13. Parents will be informed in person or through the student's diary about their ward's misconduct, untidiness, improper uniform etc.
14. All school dues(School fees, SMS, Fees Cycle Stand Fees) to be cleared according to the instruction given in the fee book.
15. Ensure that your ward is escorted safely to the school and back home.
16. No tuition will be taken from the teachers who teach in the school. Parents should inculcate regular self study habit in their wards.
17. For reasons, such as absence from a test or examination without bonafide reason and /non-payment of school fees pupil's name will be struck off from the rolls.

18. Any other future change made in the general regulation of the school and in tuition fees or any other charges will be binding to parents or guardians.
19. The school would like the parents to maintain a close rapport with the teachers of their children. Parents are advised to meet the Principal, Vice-Principal, Co-ordinator or teachers according to the schedule given below or by prior appointment.
20. Parents are requested to send the lunch box along with their wards only.
21. Issue of Transfer Certificate:

Parents requesting for Transfer Certificate of their children should submit their application together with clearance certificate duly completed to the school office 10 days in advance.

22. Issue of Various types of Certificate:

Parents requesting for the Principal's signature on various types of Certificates should submit the certificate / applications three days in advance. Parents are requested not to insist on issue of certificate on the spot and should be routed through school office/class teachers.

Parents can meet Vice Principal/Headmistress/Teachers on 4th Saturdays and dispersal of students on the working days.

The office will remain open on all working days from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. only.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- ☛ Bus fee must be deposited quarterly i.e. 10 April, 10 July, 10 Oct, and 10 January of each quarter . Fee will be paid for complete 12 months (including Summer vacation).
- ☛ If any parent fails to deposit the fee by due date, sum of ₹50/- per day will be paid additional as late fee.
- ☛ Any parent who wants to withdraw his/her child from taking bus facility in mid of the session, will pay fee for complete quarter.
- ☛ Charges will be as decided by school managing committee.
- ☛ All students, using the school bus are expected to be on the right side of the bus stop at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- ☛ Students will be charged additional amount for parking their cycle in cycle stand.
- ☛ Army bus can be availed only by the wards of defence employees.



HEALTH AND HYGIENE

Parents who wish to see the answer script of the Annual Examination, may apply to the Principal on the prescribed format against the payment of Rs. 250/- per answer script, within 3 days after the declaration of the results. Supplementary Examination of Rs. 500/-each subject.

PROMOTION

Promotion is granted on the basis of the whole year's work of the students as per AWES rules. It is very important for the pupil to be regular in work and attendance at least 75% attendance is mandatory.

No child will be promoted to the higher class in the middle of the session. It is imperative for every student to complete the course and appear in the Annual Examination. If a child fails consecutively for two years in the same class she/he will be expelled from the School.

PASS PERCENTAGE

1. For classes VI to IX, to pass an examination a candidate must obtain not less than 33% in each subject.
2. For Class XI, to pass an examination a candidate should **obtain not less than 33% marks in each subject. In case of a subject involving practical work, a student must obtain 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in practical separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate** in order to qualify in the subject. A student failing in one subject will be eligible to take the supplementary examination and will be promoted to the next higher class subject to passing the examination.
